
10. THE FORT MCCOY REGION'S RECREATION AND LEISURE OPPORTUNITIES



An abundance of recreation and leisure opportunities has made Western Wisconsin a Midwest tourist destination. The Fort McCoy Region has numerous recreational and leisure opportunities for all walks of life and interests. Whether an individual's interests are passive or active activities, the area provides ample opportunities. It is this diverse recreational and scenic environment that attracts people to western Wisconsin and creates a quality of life that is unsurpassed. Such an area will assist Fort McCoy in recruiting military personnel, maintaining morale and increase military employee retention.

The Fort McCoy Region has thirteen public golf courses to choose from. Five courses are nine hole courses and eight courses are regulation eighteen hole courses. The golf courses vary in difficulty, so all skill levels will be challenged. All the courses exhibit natural beauty as they are located within the scenic hidden valleys and rolling ridges of the region. Seven of the

courses are located in and around the City of La Crosse. The Tomah area has three golf courses, while the City of Sparta has the Sparta Municipal Golf Course, which is considered one of the finest public golf courses in the state. In addition, more than fifteen other golf courses are located within a short drive of the Fort McCoy Region.

The Fort McCoy Region is rich in wildlife and wildlife habitat with thousands of acres of state and county forests providing public hunting opportunities. In Jackson County alone, there are over 200,000 acres of public land available for hunting. The oak and pine forests along with the rolling cropland provide excellent habitat for numerous species of game.

Wisconsin is recognized as one of the premier deer hunting states in the Nation and the Fort McCoy Region is home to a thriving deer herd. Whitetail deer can be harvested with either a gun, muzzleloader or bow. In the Fort McCoy Region, whitetail deer populations range from 38 to 53 deer per square mile and annually over 4.1 whitetail bucks are harvested per square mile. Only a mere 60 minutes away is the famous Zone 61 in Buffalo County, Wisconsin, where annually some of the largest scoring whitetail bucks are harvested.

In the spring, Wisconsin offers six weeks of hunting eastern wild turkeys. Gobbling can be heard from February to June throughout the forests and rolling hills. Depending on the season hunted, hunter success ranges from 25% to 40%. In addition to excellent whitetail deer and eastern wild turkey hunting, waterfowl hunting for duck and geese is excellent in the region. Grouse, pheasant, and small game are also plentiful in the area.

Whether a fisherman enjoys lake, stream or river fishing the Fort McCoy Region has plenty of options for all anglers. Excellent Brown Trout and Brook Trout fishing can be found in many of the Class I, Class II, and Class III trout streams that flow through the hills and valleys. In Jackson County alone there are over 250 miles of trout fishing streams with over 95 miles being Class I water. Fly-fishing for the various species of trout is very popular in the region.

The ample supply of lakes, rivers and flowages in the region supply anglers with excellent opportunities to catch musky, walleye, northern pike, largemouth bass, smallmouth bass, and panfish. In the winter, these waters provide excellent ice fishing locations. The Black River that flows through the region is known for its

musky, walleye and smallmouth bass. Lake Onalaska is famous for pan fishing.

The region's lakes, rivers and streams provide a forum for a variety of water-based activities. The areas lakes and Mississippi River provide ample opportunities for water skiing, jet skiing, or boating. The areas rivers and streams are known for scenic canoeing and kayaking as they wind through the valleys. The Black River, La Crosse River and Kickapoo River are the most popular rivers in the region to canoe/kayak.

In the Fort McCoy Region on just about any weekend a local community festival can be found. The festivals celebrate local events and past historical happenings. All of the festivals are a source of local pride and demonstrate the local resident's commitment to community in addition to enhancing the quality of life in the area. Following is a description of a few of the larger regional and community festivals.

Monroe, Jackson and La Crosse County Fairs - Wisconsin has a long history of county fairs and the Fort McCoy Region is no different. Monroe, Jackson, and La Crosse counties each annually put on a county fair. The fairs provide animal displays and competitions, arts and crafts, food displays and competitions, demolition derbies, carnival rides and notable music entertainers. The fairs attract thousands of people and usually last four to five days.

Sparta Butterfest - In the second week of June, the City of Sparta annually hosts its "Butterfest." The event has been held for twenty years and is one of the region's most popular festivals. The event has activities such as arts and crafts, flea market, auto show, food tent,

parade, softball, horseshoe and golf tournaments, a carnival and live entertainment.

Wisconsin Dairyland National Tractor/truck Pull (Tomah) - The City of Tomah is home to the Wisconsin Dairyland National Tractor/Truck Pull. The tractor/truck pull is held each June and is the number one rated tractor/truck pull in the Nation. Competitors travel from across the United States and Canada to compete in the annual event.

Warrens Cranberry Festival - The Village of Warren's has the largest concentration of cranberry marshes in the area. Each year in late September the Warrens Cranberry Festival is held and attracts more than 100,000 visitors. One of the main attractions of the event is over 1,200 booths that are set up that feature arts and crafts, food and cranberry products. The event celebrates the region's rich cranberry heritage.

City of La Crosse Oktoberfest and Riverfest - The City of La Crosse holds two large celebrations annually that attract thousands of visitors to the area. Riverfest is held over the 4th of July along the Mississippi River at Riverside Park in La Crosse. Activities include music, demonstrations, games, food and fireworks. Oktoberfest is held in late September and early October each year. It is a nine day festival that draws thousands of visitors. Oktoberfest visitors will enjoy great food and music entertainment as well as displays, games, rides and large parades.

The Fort McCoy Region offers a variety of theaters, museums, and art centers for entertainment. There are seven movie theatres in the region with over 32 screens to view the most recent motion picture releases. The movie theatres are located in La Crosse, Tomah, Sparta and Black River Falls.

Area residents are active in their support of local performance theatres. The Fort McCoy Region boasts four community theatres. The Falls Players Community Theatre is based in Black River Falls. It showcases local talent and produces three major plays a year. In 1976 Fort McCoy founded the Area Community Theatre (ACT). The ACT has civilian and military performers that present three to four plays a year. The City of La Crosse has the La Crosse Community Theatre that produces seven shows during the September to June season. The Village of Holmen has the Holmen Community Theatre which produces plays for the summer months.

The region also has two dance theatres that provide such productions as the “Nutmcracker” and “Sleeping Beauty.” The Monroe-Jackson Dance Theatre was founded in Tomah and sponsors performances throughout the region. The La Crosse Dance Theatre has been performing for local residents for over fifteen years.

Local museums offer an excellent look at the region's past and contribute to the area's heritage. The museums are located throughout the region. Some of the more popular museums in the region are the Deke Slayton Memorial Space and Bike Museum, the Harris G. Allen Telecommunications Historical Museum, Wisconsin Cranberry Discovery Center, Norskedalen, Fort McCoy Historical Center, Little Falls Railroad and Doll Museum, Children's Museum of La Crosse and the Gideon Hixon House.

Within the Fort McCoy Region is a great appreciation of fine arts. This is demonstrated by the local theatres and art galleries. The Pump House in La Crosse is maintained by the Pump House Regional Arts Center which provides fine art venues to the Fort McCoy Region. The Pump House has four art galleries and a 140 seat theatre. Also, located in the City of La Crosse is the Viterbo University Fine Arts Center which houses a main theatre, a recital hall, a theatre for plays, and several art galleries. The City of Black River Falls has the Lunda Theatre, a 570 seat auditorium, which is used by local groups and organizations for cultural events.

The Fort McCoy Region also offers excellent symphony music, orchestras, and choirs. The La Crosse Symphony Orchestra was founded back in 1898 and has performed classical music for the region ever since. The La Crosse Symphony Orchestra provides residents with live performances of some of the world's greatest music. The La Crosse Symphony Orchestra is very versatile as it performs opera concerts and pops concerts as well. Orchestra experiences are also available for the youth in the region as the La Crosse Youth Symphony Orchestra performs two concerts annually.

The Fort McCoy Region is home to several choral groups. The Coulee Chordsmen is a choral group of more than 50 men that sing a cappella in barbershop harmony style. The Coulee Chordsmen perform throughout the area. The La Crosse Choral Union is a community chorus of students and adults that perform a

winter and spring concert. Available for the youth performers in the region are the La Crosse Boyschoir and the La Crosse Girlschoir.

The three county area around Fort McCoy provides a variety of shopping opportunities. A regional mall is located in the City of La Crosse and various other local retail centers are located in cities and villages in the region. Treasure hunters enjoy the area because of the many antique shops and flea markets. Unique gifts are available in the numerous specialty shops in the region. Amish settlements provide a rare opportunity to purchase many handmade quilts, candies and furniture pieces.

The Fort McCoy Region offers some of the best bicycling opportunities in the Midwest. The City of Sparta is known as the “Bicycling Capitol of America.” Wisconsin's 32 mile Elroy-Sparta State Trail travels through Sparta. It was the first rails to trails (railroad track to bike trail) conversion in the nation. The Elroy-Sparta State Trail is part of a much larger trail network. It is connected to the 13 mile Omaha Trail, the 22 mile 400 State Trail, the 21.5 mile La Crosse River State

Trail, and the 24 mile Great River State Trail. This trail system provides over 110 miles of uninterrupted bike trails from Reedsburg to Trempealeau in western Wisconsin. Bicyclists along the trails will see hidden valleys, travel through railroad tunnels and bicycle along the Mississippi River.

The Fort McCoy Region also offers many other bicycling adventures. The town and county roads in the region can be bicycled by individuals who can make up their own travel routes. In addition, off-road bikers will find an

abundance of mountain bike trails particularly in the Black River State Forest.

In the winter season, the Fort McCoy Region offers great nordic skiing, alpine skiing, and snowmobiling.

With the various biking, hiking, and snowmobile trails in the Fort McCoy Region, cross country skiing enthusiasts have an easy time locating scenic trails for skiing. For downhill skiers and snowboarders, Mt. La Crosse offers the most challenging downhill slopes in the region with a 516-foot vertical drop. Whitetail Ridge located in Fort McCoy is popular for snowboarding, snow tubing and downhill skiing.

Hundreds of miles of groomed snowmobile trails exist in the Fort McCoy Region. Several of the scenic bicycle trails are utilized for snowmobiling. In addition, local clubs maintain an intricate system of trails that connect just about every city and village in the region. The local trail network is connected to the State Trail System which provides miles of snowmobile pleasure.

The Fort McCoy Region has two asphalt racing tracks that hold weekly auto racing events. The Tomah/Sparta Speedway is a ½ mile semi-banked asphalt oval located in Tomah. The La Crosse Fairgrounds Speedway located in West Salem is Wisconsin's only sanctioned racetrack. The speedway has two ovals; a 5/8 mile asphalt oval and a ¼ mile inner oval. The track is visited by thousands of spectators and is used weekly by the NASCAR Weekly Racing Series Late Models.

If camping is desired there is no better location than the Fort McCoy Region with over 2,000 sites available. From primitive wilderness camping to full service hook ups ample room is available. Camping sites can be found in private campgrounds and public state and county parks/forests. All the sites are located amidst the vast recreational resources of the area.

Goose Island County Park is an example of the great camping opportunities in the Fort McCoy Region. The 710 acre county park is located along the backwaters of the Mississippi River. The park has 400 campsites available which makes it the largest county operated campground in the State of Wisconsin. The park has over 200 acres devoted to picnic sites and field games. In addition, visitors can walk the nature trails, paddle the 6 mile canoe trail, fish the backwaters or just relax and enjoy the view of the federal wildlife refuge. Yogi Bear Jellystone campground located near Warrens with its

700 campsites, swimming pool, lake and waterslides is another popular campground.



High Quality Camping Opportunities are Plentiful in the Fort McCoy Region

Lake Wazee, Wisconsin's deepest inland lake, is a unique man-made freshwater lake located in Jackson County. Lake Wazee was formed by the reclamation of an old iron mine. The lake reaches a depth of 355 feet with visibility of up to 40 feet. Lake Wazee has crystal clear water and has become known as the Midwest's finest location for scuba diving. Remnants and artifacts of the old mining operation can be seen through the pristine water. The lake is also an excellent fishing resource.

North America's longest river the Mississippi and the Upper Mississippi River National Wildlife and Fish Refuge is located 30 minutes from Fort McCoy. Besides being of functional transportation value to the Fort McCoy Region, the Mississippi River and the Upper Mississippi River National Wildlife and Fish Refuge provides an abundance of recreational opportunities. The wildlife and

fish refuge encompasses over 200,000 acres of backwaters and islands stretching the whole length of the Mississippi River in the Fort McCoy Region.

Sight Seeing/Bird Watching - The Mississippi River is one of the most scenic rivers in Nation. The Great River Road (State Highway 35) travels along the river offering many vantage points to view the scenery. Everything can be seen, from barges carrying cargo on the river to bald eagles soaring along the bluffs. Numerous state parks, county parks, and wildlife refuges are located along the river that provide great vantage points for bird watchers.

Hunting and Fishing - The Mississippi River is an excellent year round fishing resource with anglers catching a variety of fish; walleye, northern pike, largemouth bass, small mouth bass, crappie, sunfish and catfish to name a few.

Numerous local bass and walleye tournaments are held on the Mississippi throughout the spring, summer and fall. In addition, the Cabela's Masters Walleye Circuit and the Wal-Mart FLW Tour Bass Fishing Everstart Series regularly schedule fishing tournaments on the Mississippi River in the La Crosse area.

The Mississippi River is also abundant with wildlife. The river is comprised of many miles of backwater and wetlands which make it an ideal area to hunt ducks and geese. The Mississippi River serves as a flyway for Canadian geese and Snow geese as well as a variety of ducks (mallards, canvas backs, etc.). The many islands on the river are also habitat for whitetail deer.

Water Sports - The Mississippi River provides some of the best opportunities for water-based activities in the

region. Canoe and kayak enthusiasts enjoy paddling through the expansive backwaters and hundreds of islands. Recreational boaters travel the river in houseboats, pontoons, yachts, speedboats and fishing boats. A sailboat can even be seen from time to time. Jet skiing, water skiing and tubing are other popular water based activities that are common on the river.

Lodging and Camping - Numerous hotels and bed and breakfasts are available along the Mississippi. If a person's interest is to stay right on the river, rustic camping (no fee) is available on the hundreds of islands in the refuge. In addition, many state parks, county parks and private parks provide camping sites.

The Wisconsin Dells recreation activities are just a short drive away. Within an hours drive of Fort McCoy is the Wisconsin Dells, one of the largest family vacation areas in the Midwest. The Wisconsin Dells offers the Nation's largest indoor waterparks, scenic river tours, jet boat rides, and exhilarating roller coasters.

Additional recreation and leisure activities in the region are swimming, all terrain vehicle (ATV) trails, horseback riding trails, walking and hiking trails, driving tours, state parks, county parks, and municipal parks. As demonstrated, the Fort McCoy Region has a seemingly endless supply of recreation and leisure activities all which make the area unique and enhance the quality of life.

The Fort McCoy Region offers many places of worship. This is demonstrated by the diversity and number of places to worship in the region. In 2003, there were over 225 places of worship in the Fort McCoy Region.

Fort McCoy Region has affordable regional lodging accommodations. There are over 75 businesses that can provide lodging accommodations in the Fort McCoy and Volk Field area. As the table on the following pages show, a conservative estimate identifies that there are over 3,000 rooms available with a wide variable of rates. Rates begin as low as \$35 and can go as high as \$200+ for a night's stay. There are accommodations available to fit any need. Amenities available include restaurants, lounge/bar facility, indoor and outdoor pools, indoor waterpark, whirlpools, saunas, cable TV, meeting and conference rooms, high speed Internet, boating, cross county and down hill skiing. A comprehensive inventory of these lodging accommodations is listed in Table 10.1.
