## 2. Policy Committee Business

a. The Minutes from the March 6, 2012, Policy Committee meeting were approved.

b. Bryan Law of the MRRPC presented the draft of the JLUS as edited after the March 6, 2012, meeting. Mr. Law noted the addition of a decibel comparison chart, provided by the Ft. McCoy Public Affairs Office, which will be helpful in judging the effects of noise levels in the areas outside Ft. McCoy where artillery training can be heard. The Policy Committee reviewed the list of "Land Use Compatibility Tools Available to Ft. McCoy and Monroe County," which will be incorporated into the JLUS.

The Policy Committee reviewed the "Mitigation Efforts the Fort and Surrounding Communities Can Undertake," which is the heart of the JLUS. Some suggestions were given to be added to the discussion of mitigation efforts. One suggestion was the effect on night-vision training that frac-sand mining could have, and that there should be some mention of zoned towns requiring

down-pointing lights or other light-pollution-reduction techniques, such as berms and tree plantings, at mining sites. Mitigation Effort #2 was suggested to be changed from maintaining the *agricultural* character of Monroe County maintaining the *rural* character of Monroe County. Mitigation Effort #3 was suggested to be changed so that it emphasized that any significant change in Ft. McCoy activities would trigger announcements in local media, on the Fort's website, and mailings to affected landowners. Another suggestion was to look into adding information about noise attenuation in any information packets supplied to applicants for new building permits; but that such noise attenuation could not be required.

c. The next Policy Committee meeting was scheduled for Tuesday, July 17, 2012, at 6:00 p.m., at the Rolling Hills Auditorium (if available). **NOTE**: This meeting date was postponed when the MRRPC requested and was granted an extension to complete the JLUS.
