TREMPEALEAU COUNTY INDUSTRY CLUSTER AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES

The following is an analysis of the County's Industry Clusters and some examples on how to build Knowledge Based industries and further develop intraregional trade.

Trempealeau County's Diverse Manufacturing Provides Significant Economic Impact

Trempealeau County has over 70 companies producing a wide-range of products making manufacturing the leading income and employment sector in the County. The more prominent industry clusters in terms of number employed and total sales driving the County's manufacturing sector include: 1) Wood and Furniture Products; 2) Food Processing; 3) Machinery, Equipment, and Electronic Products; 4) Transportation and Equipment; and 5) Metal Products. Table 9.01 provides an overview of many of the industries within their respective industry clusters grouping including the ones just listed. Table 9.10 illustrates that in 1998 manufacturers in the County were the highest source of personal income generating approximately \$139 million. In addition, manufacturing employment led all sectors of the County's economy with approximately 5,000 workers or 30% of the total workforce, Table 9.09. The manufacturing employment also contributed to the growth in the Service sector and other employment sectors such as Retail Trade and Farm employment. Manufacturing also contributed to the \$28.5 million in traveler and tourism expenditures in the County in 1999 since visitors to the County for business reasons are included in this figure, Table 9.07. Manufacturing employment also contributed to the 5.5% growth in population and the 13% growth in housing between 1990 and 2000, Tables 9.03 and Table 9.04 respectively. The County's enviable 2.9% low unemployment rate in 2000 is directly related to the manufacturing jobs and the spin off effect created in other employment sectors, Table 5.08. The County's unemployment rate was below the Region, State and Nation.

There are Opportunities to Further Build the County's Industry Base Through Actions That More Fully Integrate the County's Industries With the Knowledge Based Industry Clusters That Drive the State's Economy and Through Actions That Facilitate Increased Intraregional Trade

Growth in manufacturing or in "basic industries" is often a major factor in determining whether a region's economy prospers or declines. To further bolster and create greater opportunities for growth in our region's industries there are actions that can be taken to more fully integrate our industry clusters with the Knowledge Based Industry Clusters that drive the State's economy.

The following table identifies the County's industry clusters in relation to the Knowledge Based Industry Clusters driving the State's economy. An explanation of these industry clusters and recommendations on how to further build these Knowledge Based Clusters are provided on Pages 1-2 through 1-10. Maps 1-13 beginning on Page 11-1 illustrate the concentration of these clusters within the County.

A Survey Mailed to Approximately 600 Industries in the Region Identifies Other Opportunities to Help Build the County's Industry Clusters

The survey was centered around the concept of promoting regional import substitution strategies. These strategies involved promoting the concept that industries should buy raw materials or components needed for production within the Region as opposed to from outside the Region if practical. The survey's primary emphasis was therefore on identifying the products produced by the Region's industries and the raw materials or components needed to produce their products. The survey also centered in on seven other information areas that could also lead to additional intraregional trade and industry cluster growth. These were: (1) Labor force development plans, 2) Identifying raw materials or components that are difficult to procure in order to manufacture their product, 3) Interest in contract manufacturing with another business or entrepreneur, 4) Interest in using an intermodal freight transfer facility (*rail to truck*), 5) Interest in venture capital financing, 6) Interest in revolving loan fund financing, and 7) Interest in development an industry matchmaker procurement website. The survey allowed each industry to respond by circling a number from one to five with "one" meaning, no I am definitely not interested, and "five" meaning, yes I am definitely interested. Industries responding to any questions with a three, four, or five on a given question are listed in Table 9.02. Some economic development concepts and opportunities based on the results of this survey are outlined below.

- Seventy-six manufacturers in the nine county area indicated in the survey their interest in a matchmaker procurement website. Twelve of these companies are located in Trempealeau County. Specific industry cluster procurement websites should be set up to assist in multi-company cost sharing and obtaining raw material quantity discounts.
- In the Mississippi River Regional Planning Commission's (MRRPC) Economic Development District there are over 90 manufacturers of lumber, wood products, furniture and fixtures including 18 located in Trempealeau County. This industry cluster provides jobs for over 3,600 workers and have combined sales in excess of \$600 million making it an immense economic force that reaches far beyond county and regional boundaries. Ashley Furniture Industries, Inc. with it's manufacturing operations located in the cities of Whitehall, Arcadia and Independence anchors this industry cluster with over 3,000 employees and sales in excess of \$500 million. At least two other wood industries in Trempealeau County have started as a result of Ashley Furniture's presence. Wood and furniture product manufacturing is an obvious industry cluster strength in the County. Economic development initiatives in the form of development, financing and labor force development should be targeted at this industry cluster.
- Fifteen manufacturers in the County indicated in a survey their interest in contract manufacturing. Collectively they
 produce such products as hardwood lumber, wood cabinet and furniture parts, construction equipment, agricultural
 fertilizers and animal feed to name a few items. Existing businesses or entrepreneurs who can make use of this
 manufacturing resource should be informed about this manufacturing resource available to them which would
 increase the production capacity of these industries.
- Additional opportunities should be investigated to see if other wood product producers in the Region can supply Ashley Furniture, Inc. with the raw materials needed for their products.
- Over 80 companies on the survey expressed interest in labor force development activities including fifteen manufacturers in Trempealeau County. Universities and technical colleges and others involved in workforce development should investigate providing training tailored to a specific industry cluster.

- Over 60 companies in Region, including 11 in Trempealeau County, expressed interest in angel or venture capital and revolving loan fund funding. Business financing workshops should be organized to provide information on these various forms of financing.
- In the interest of promoting intraregional trade and industry cluster growth, are there any businesses or individuals in the Region that have a need for the following products produced by industries in Trempealeau County or can provide the following raw materials or components to them? This list of products, raw materials and components is based off returns from the Region wide industry survey. This is therefore not a complete list of all the products, raw materials and components needed in the County.

The slash "/" used in these lists identify where one industrys' product or raw material need begins and ends. The County's percentage rate of employment growth of 17% from 1990 to 1998 exceeded the U.S. 15% reporting rate, tied the State 17% rate, and was less than the Region's 19% rate. Construction; Services; Transportation and Public Utilities; Finance, Insurance and Real Estate; and Manufacturing were the county's leading employment industries with growth rates of 48%, 35%, 32%, 29% and 26% respectively. Despite this growth in these industries, Manufacturing was still the leading employment sector in the County in 1998 employing approximately 30% of the workforce.

The greatest percentage rate of growth in source of personal income in the County from 1990 to 1998 (thousands of dollars) occurred in Transportation and Public Utilities 124%; Construction 88%; Services 72%; Manufacturing 69%; and Finance, Insurance and Real Estate 62%. The percentage growth in Transportation and Public Utilities; Construction; and Manufacturing income in the County outpaced the rate of growth in both the State and Nation. From 1990 to 1998 the industry source that experienced the greatest rate of earnings decline was Farming with a 38% decrease during this period.
