The following Planning Activities are proposed to assist these communities with economic recovery and long term sustainability: (1) site relocation decision research, (2) site design for community economic development and resettlement, (3) community facility assessment engineering and design, (4) public infrastructure engineering assessment and design, (5) project cost estimating, (6) real estate appraisal, (7) environmental assessment and (8) public participation. | June 2020- December 2021 | Grant application was submitted in June 2019. The total project will be \$925,000 with \$185,000 in local match. The MRRPC received a letter dated January 10, 2020 that EDA has approved the grant. RFP's were sent out in February. Each Village received 9 proposals. Each Village met separately and selected who they wanted to have as a consultant. Individual Consultants have been working with the Villages. Readstown selected SHC, Ontario selected MSA and both Viola and La Farge selected Vierbicher. Initial kickoff meetings have been held in each of the villages. Consultants have been working on gathering public input within each community. Readstown is still gathering public input through charettes, due to the Villages offices closing down for the month of December this process will go into January. Infrastructure assessments and business interviews have been completed. Ontario has a draft relocation plan developed which identifies a relocation site and is working on identifying costs associated with developing that site. Viola has a draft relocation plan developed but not yet approved by the Village Board. | Report on City of Westby Industrial Park EDA Grant. | The Cities of Mondovi and Westby are both pursuing Federal EDA grants to develop new industrial parks. Mondovi's New Industrial Park will be located on the City's West side it will be 210 acres in size and serve an expanding industry that will locate there and create 25 jobs. Included within the boundary of the industrial park will be the City's new wastewater treatment facility that will use an anerobic digester that will also generate electricity for the City. The total project cost is expected to be \$7.5 million with 50% the costs hopefully covered by a Federal EDA grant. The City of Westby is planning a 74-acre industrial park on the north | Westby's grant application was submitted on Grants.Gov on October 3,2019. Requested additional information was submitted on November 30, 2019. | Westby's Grant application was submitted on October 3, 2019. EDA announced the financial award for Westby April 21, 2020. MRRPC is in communication with EDA on the progress of funding. Quarterly reports have been submitted and all checklist material for contracts with engineering and administration is complete.
