
Takeaways

- As of 2022 the region's population declined by 0.5% since 2017, falling by 84. Population is expected to decrease by 0.9% between 2022 and 2027, losing 146.
- From 2017 to 2022, jobs declined by 8.4% in Crawford County, WI from 8,307 to 7,608. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 3.8% by 12.2%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 62.3% to 53.5% between 2017 and 2022.
- Concerning educational attainment, **12.4% of Crawford County, WI residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (8.4% below the national average), and **12.8% hold an Associate's Degree** (4.0% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2022 are Warehousing and Storage, Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals, and Restaurants and Other Eating Places.











Unemployment by Ethnicity







Job Trends








Crawford County, WI had an April 2023 unemployment rate of 3.23%, decreasing from 3.66% 5 years before.


Millennials

Crawford County, WI has 2,478 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 3,284.




Veterans

Crawford County, WI has 1,101 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 844.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Crawford County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 4,778 people 55 or older, while there are 6,447 here.




Violent Crime

Racial diversity is low in Crawford County, WI. The national average for an area this size is 6,542 racially diverse people, while there are 1,030 here.




Property Crime








Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Employment Concentration






Top Industry GRP



Top Occupation Employment Concentration









